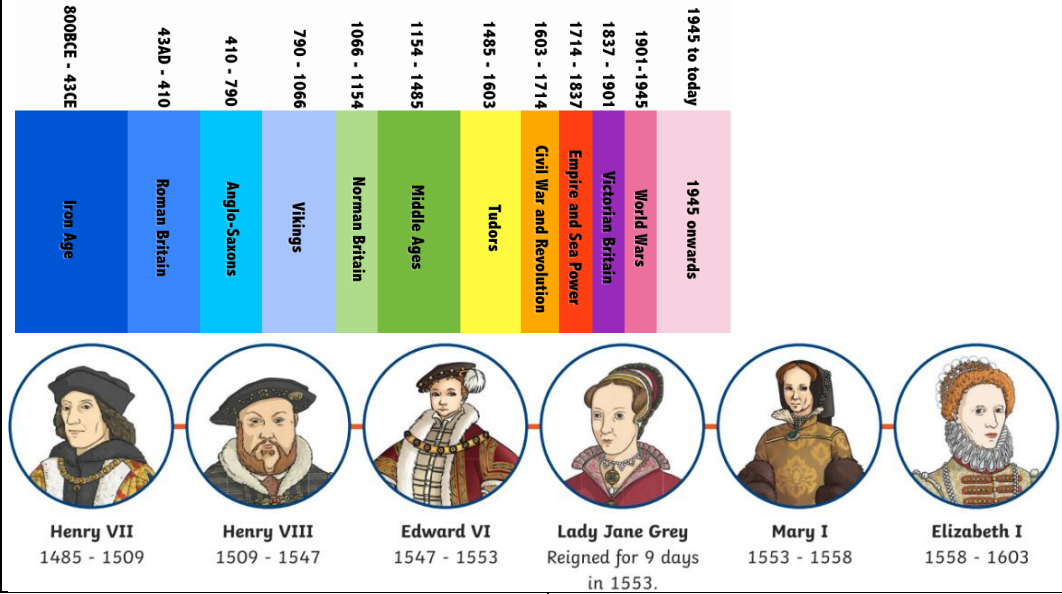

Key Events

1485	Henry Tudor is crowned King Henry VII.
1509	Henry VII dies. His son, Henry VIII becomes King.
1534	Henry VIII forms the Church of England, separating it from the Roman Catholic Church.
1547	Henry VIII dies. His son, Edward VI becomes King aged 9 years old.
1553	Edward VI dies and the throne is given to Lady Jane Grey (Edward's cousin once removed) for just 9 days before Mary I takes the throne .
1558	Mary I dies. Her half-sister Elizabeth I is Queen of England.
1588	The Spanish Armada is defeated by the English.
1603	Queen Elizabeth I dies ending the Tudor reign .

Vocabulary

Monarchy - A form of government that has a single person known as a monarch at its head.

Reign - To rule over a country as a monarch.

Succession - The act of following or coming after something or someone else.

Throne - The position of a king or queen.

Marriage - A union between individual people.

Divorce - To end a marriage by law.

Reformation - The name given to the reform (changing) of the Church.

Church of England - A Christian religion established under the rule of Henry VIII, when he broke away from the Catholic Church.

Catholic - Having to do with the Roman Catholic Church. The Pope is the head of the Catholic Church.

Protestant - A type of Christian believer. Protestants do not belong to the Catholic Church.

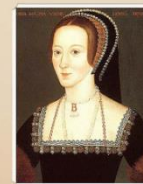
